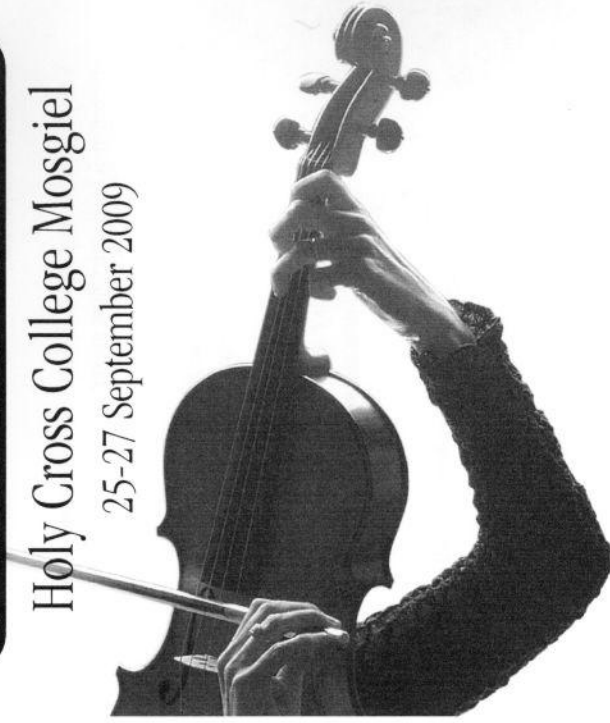
**Jim McKay - Clarinet**
